On October 3, 2005, our beloved Dick Cadd was admitted into the Heavenly Choir. Wish I could hear him now! He was 81.

Dick was born in Redondo Beach, CA, and grew up on a farm near Camas, WA. In 1943, Dick entered the Navy and served on the USS Tennessee as a radar operator. He survived the battle of Leyte and kamikaze attacks during the battle for Okinawa. After the war, he attended Pacific College, now George Fox University, where he met and married his wife of 58 years, Helen Antrim. There he also met the men with whom he formed The Four Flats quartet.

The Four Flats traveled for Youth for Christ, eventually becoming the World Vision Quartet. In 1957 they sang at a month-long crusade in Manila where he gained a burden and love for the people. He returned as a missionary in 1962.

For the next fifteen years, Dick directed the choirs at Faith Academy. Mr. Cadd taught us to sing, made us laugh, and showed us how to pray. He demonstrated how to entertain and minister through music. His choirs were the best. (Sorry Dan.) Who else could have taken a random group of high school kids and created the world-famous Madri-Gals & Guys whom he led on tours of the west coast in 1970, Europe and the east coast in 1974, and the west coast again in 1976?!

Dick and Helen left Faith in 1977 and joined Action International Ministries to work more directly with the people of Manila. They were involved in video and television production, working with both the homeless poor

and entertainment personalities. Later they found themselves filming documentaries in post-Communist Eastern Europe, Hong Kong, and Haiti. They worked with Sword Productions, an evangelistic movie and video production ministry in Manila founded and directed by their son Steve. The Cadds

retired to Newberg, Oregon in 1995, where Dick had been writing about his times with The Four Flats and The Madri-Gals & Guys.

At his memorial service, many memories were shared and accolades given commemorating the life of this remarkable man. Three things mentioned about him stand out in my mind: his wonderful, loving relationship with his wife; his genuine, humble, fun-loving personality, which enabled him to laugh like no other; and his ability to see and believe in the good in other people. It is this last trait that means the most to me.

In 1974 I was suspended from Faith for involvement with drugs. Needless to say, I was quite a rebel. While I was out of school, I gave my life to the Lord and was dramatically changed. When I returned to school, some teachers did not believe or accept my conversion, but Mr. Cadd saw it without being told, admitting me into Mads the following year. What a wonderful thing that was in my life! So it was a privilege for me to honor this great man by attending his memorial service. How can we say thanks for the things he has done for us?

UNIFORMS ARRIVE AT FAITH

A bold new fashion trend has hit Faith this year. Everywhere you look, students are sporting “Faithwear” in a variety of colors and styles.

The reasons for the change were simple. Faith and Brent Baguio were possibly the last K-12 schools in the Philippines that did not have uniforms (Brent Baguio also initiated uniforms this year). Our friendly rival, ISM, converted to uniforms two years ago. So it was natural for Faith to choose uniforms as the dress standard.

Another reason for uniforms was the hassle of trying to enforce a dress code. The more detailed the code became, the more things it overlooked. On the other hand, when it was adjusted to be more general, it became harder to interpret when a student was in violation. Uniforms have made interpretation of the dress code much easier.

The final, most important driving force behind uniforms was the lack of modest clothing options available for students. Some female students even approached the high school principal and asked for uniforms because they found it hard to find clothes that met dress code guidelines.

The process of making a decision about uniforms was comprehensive. The superintendent used the entire first semester of the 2004-2005 school year to gather data. Parents,

students and faculty were polled about their attitudes to the dress code and the possibility of uniforms. After that, parents and students were invited to be part of focus groups that allowed for more detailed input on the subject.

The support for uniforms was strong, so a decision was finalized by semester’s end. During the second semester, a committee was formed to decide what would comprise the Faith Academy uniform.

In the end, the school designed a uniform “system” that is sharp looking, but somewhat casual. Both boys and girls may choose from navy, light blue or white polo shirts—or a light blue oxford-style shirt. Girls may choose navy or khaki skirts, pants or capris (elementary girls may also choose “skorts”). Boys have the option of navy or khaki pants or walking shorts.

All the shirts have a small Faith

Academy picture logo, but nothing else that advertises the school. This is a security measure that the school learned from IS and Brent. In this age of kidnapping and terrorism, international schools are doing everything they can to keep a low profile. Even the school vans have painted over the school colors that set them apart in traffic for so many years.

So far, the transition to uniforms has been fairly well accepted, although not without some learning pains. Adults (and even some students) say they like the style of the uniforms, and that campus has a better overall look and feel.




